2012-2013 Student Enrollment

There are many reasons for this, foremost being our relationship with Rutland Public Schools, which creates cost efficiencies based upon the size of the District. • As soon as school ended in June John Bixby (Electrical/Plumbing), Jeff Fowler (Construction Technology) and Cheryl Niedzwiecki (Hospitality & Entrepreneurship)

were off to the National SkillsUSA Competition in Kansas City with four of our students. As always, the students represented themselves, Stafford and Vermont very well.

- Sue Densmore (Human Services) traveled to Orlando Florida with three students for the 67th Anniversary National Convention of FCCLA. Three students took part and returned with a Silver Medal at that National Level. Congratulations Sue! We will want to hear more when everyone returns.
- Summer Arts and Technology Camp was again very successful this year. Dave Warrender organized a summer offering that included the skills of George Ambrose (RAB member), former STC students and current instructors. Almost 70 students took part and enjoyed a wide variety of activities.

Soon thereafter, week-long camps in Digital Arts (Karen Kysar), Music (Bill Comstock) and Culinary Arts (Lisa Fennimore) took place with 9th grade aspiring students. A culminating celebration was well attended by family and friends.

At the same time, John Bixby's two-week Summer Construction Camp, was appreciated by another talented group of young up and coming Stafford students. Students learned more about the options available to them in the construction industry. While doing so, they built high quality picnic tables and donated them to area non-profit organizations and schools.

Also, Sharon Ryan (Special Educator) began oversight of Friday MOVE Camps, which involved students from Rutland Middle School's summer program. Again, current Stafford instructors support the sessions with their skills.

• Bill Lucci's Continuing Education Program will be hosting the VTC/CCV Associate Degree in Nursing Program this fall. Initially, students will take their first year on the VTC campus and then have the option of completing the second year at STC.

Room 218, the former Computer Technology lab, will be the new space for the General Electric Electronic Technician Program, which is a collaborative effort between GE, VTC and STC.

- Several rooms have been upgraded this summer. New paint has freshened up the Automotive Technology program. New tile and paint in Health Careers has added that needed 'clinical' look that instructor Dianna Bassett has hoped for. And, the newly renovated First-year Cosmetology classroom greeted new students in room 216.
- It is time to revamp the STC website. Stay tuned for details from Peg Bolgioni (Outreach Coordinator) and other's as it is rolled out to the public.
- A check in the amount of \$500 was provided to STC from the Rutland Area Vehicle Enthusiasts at the Annual RAVE Car show in July. It will be used for student scholarships and/or equipment.
- The Student Craft Corp is negotiating a land purchase that will support students continuing to build energy efficient homes. Jeff Fowler has put the finishing touches on one of the Student Craft houses on Stafford Lane. It is under contract and the closing is scheduled for October 15th. The second house is on the market and has had a number of positive "looks". We are keeping our fingers crossed.

• Green Mountain Power has requested permission from the Public Service Board to donate a hybrid Toyota Prius and solar panel to STC as part of renewable energy education. Stay tuned.
